Thompson's Station Holding Special Census:

Subdivision Annexation in the Works

A special census is underway to determine the current number of residents living in the town of Thompson's Station.

Forms were delivered into mailboxes at each area household on March 5. Residents have until May 15 to

Town Administrator Greg Langeliers said a second form will be mailed in mid-April as a reminder to those who have not yet returned their forms.

As the May deadline approaches, Langeliers himself will be knocking on doors to inquire residents of the number in their household-if they do not respond to the first two mail-in forms.

Langeliers estimates approximately 1,200 residents were living in Thompson's Station at the time of the

2000 federal census.

"We estimate approximately 200-300 more people than in the 2000 census," Langeliers said.

Part of this increase will be due to the annexation of the Arbor Lakes subdivision and several properties around it which is approximately 130 acres.

Langeliers said notifications were sent to subdivision homeowners last week regarding the pending annexation of their properties.

"Every municipality receives state benefits based on their total population," Langeliers said. "It made sense to do the census now because with the annexation and building, we'll come out ahead."
